## Lisa Racina-Torre

After graduating with a Bachelor of Fine Arts as a Fine Arts Guild Scholar in Ballet from Texas Christian University in Ft. Worth, Texas, Ms. Racina-Torre opened Denton Dance Conservatory in 1988. For the last 21 years, Lisa's students have performed internationally, been accepted to highly prestigious summer intensives as well as very competitive college dance and musical theatre programs. Besides running the dance studio, teaching, choreographing, etc. Ms Racina-Torre has also been adjunct professor of Ballet at the University of North Texas, professor of Ballet at the highly respected Interlochen School of the Arts summer program, and was one of twenty choreographers selected to participate in the Glenda Brown Choreography Conference in 2001 and 2003. Seeing the need in the Denton community for a pre-professional dance training company as well as a contemporary company, Ms. Racina-Torre founded the Denton City Contemporary Ballet (DCCB) as a non-profit in 1989, and its youth training company, the Denton Youth City Ballet(DYCB) in 1994. Through these two performance oriented outlets, Racina-Torre's dancers continue to excel throughout the dance community in the greater Dallas/Ft. Worth Metroplex and far beyond!

Lisa's students have been accepted to such highly acclaimed dance programs and summer intensives as Alvin Ailey, American Ballet Theatre, American Academy of Music and Drama, Atlanta Ballet, Ballet Austin, Bates College, Burklyn Ballet Theatre, Brigham Young University, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, Houston Ballet, Jaclyn Kennedy Onnasis School for Classical Ballet, Joffrey Ballet, Kansas City Ballet, Kaatsban Summer Intensive, Kirov Ballet, Minnesota Conservatory of the Arts, Oklahoma City University, Tulsa Ballet, San Francisco Ballet School, Southern Methodist University, Texas Ballet Theatre, Texas Christian University, Texas Woman's University, Dallas Arts Magnet, University of Oklahoma, University of North Texas, University of Texas at Austin, West Texas State University, and many others.
